and supported by the technology expertise of AbilityTech, has a goal to prove that technology solutions can address frustrations, concerns and meet many needs. Our intention is to work with families, caregivers and providers to ultimately identify technology that will lead to an increase in independence.

"It is my hope that we can also reach out to the rest of our community and see how we can use our tech home to benefit other in our community, such as our senior citizens and our schools, and really make a difference in the future for people," said Superintendent Carrie Beier.

Currently, the technology home has over 25 devices for visitors to experience. The home is a welcoming space with little pieces of non-intrusive support spread throughout. ## **Direct Support Professionals**

Erie County Board of DD collaborates with multiple agencies and Independent Providers who provide direct care to people in Erie County that qualify for needed services. These Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) assist people who need support to lead independent and quality lives and to participate fully in our community. ### EARLY INTERVENTION NAMED LUCKY RECIPIENT OF GRANT FUNDING

During a challenging 2020, the Help Me Grow Early Intervention team never wavered in their commitment to the families they serve in our community. With safety always a priority, the team applied for and was awarded \$5,000 through the Boeckling Chartible Trust and an additional \$3,500 from the Wightman-Wieber Foundation Grant to help purchase much-needed safety items for the families in the Help Me Grow program. Items included



baby gates, smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, cabinet locks, window and refrigerator locks and so much more! These awarded funds will help support families enrolled in Early Intervention for years to come.

The Early Intervention team is helping families stay connected through virtual opportunities each month. These virtual Zoom play groups allow parents to meet, kids to engage and provide some learning fun during an isolating time. Our team was awarded \$890 by Grace Episcopal Church to help continue these opportunities through 2021. The funds will be used to put together "kits" for the participating families that will help enhance the virtual group experience.
